The Olathe Public School District is located in Johnson County, Kansas, in the southwest part of the Kansas City metropolitan area. This predominantly suburban, residential district became the second largest school district in Kansas with its enrollment of 27,999 students encompassing the cities of Olathe, Lenexa, and Overland Park. There are 34 elementary schools (grades K-5), 9 middle schools (grades 6-9), and 4 high schools (grades 9-12). Demographers predict that the population of the Olathe School District will continue to increase at a rate of 6% per year over the next 10 years.

Olathe Northwest High School opened in August of 2003 in response to rapid growth in the northwest part of the rapidly growing Olathe Public School District.
